Dear colleagues from the incredible team of my Embassy, I bow my greying head to you, as without you, I'd be nobody around here. Vytė and I are sincerely grateful to you for everything.

And, naturally, last but not least, I'm incredibly grateful to the love of my life — my wife Vytė — whose support and love helped me not only endure the hardest moments but accomplish, dare I say, pretty great results.

My dear friends, it's a pity that Vytė and I are leaving without reaching the so-desired Victory. But we will still achieve it, and then we promise to come back and celebrate it together with you.

And before the Victory, and of course after it, we will be waiting for you all in Warsaw! So, we're not saying 'goodbye'; we're saying 'see you soon'!
