Two contemporaries, born in the same century, who left an indelible mark on their people's history and identity. Their words, thoughts, and deeds transcend the bounds of language and space, manifesting as ideas of freedom, resistance against injustice, strength of the spirit, and the importance of safeguarding national identity. Their literary legacies still carry the universal messages of upholding humanity, justice, and truth even in the harshest times. Each in their own way, our national geniuses taught us to preserve our dignity and trust in the people's strength, and now, with Ukraine defending its independence and the right to free existence, these messages are taking on a renewed meaning.

When it comes to strengthening the ties between our peoples and cities, honorary consuls of Montenegro also play an irreplaceable role. Their dedication and genuine devotion are an example of diplomacy based on mutual respect, trust, and friendship. Our country is sincerely grateful for everything they do, serving not only as representatives but as bridges connecting people and cultures.

In all the international forums under the United Nations, the Council of Europe, the Organisation for Security and Cooperation in Europe, the EU's platforms, etc., Montenegro consistently and firmly votes to support Ukraine. It's a vote for justice, international law, and peace. Montenegro was among the first countries to condemn the Russian invasion and has always voted for resolutions that assert Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity. Most importantly, perhaps, it has offered human solidarity, opening its doors to Ukrainian citizens and providing them with shelter and safety.
